HALLOWEEN TREATS

Halloween is around the corner, these super cute Resse's Bats are delicious, fun and easy to make! Here's What you'll need:

10 mini Reese's cups

5 Oreos

20 Candy eyes

1 tbsp. peanut butter

HERE'S WHAT YOU DO:

Split all Oreo cookies in half and gently remove the cream. Cut each half in half to create the wings. Using a toothpick or a small spoon, apply a small dab of peanut butter to one end of each Oreo. Press onto the Reese's cup to make wings. Next, place a small dab of peanut butter onto the back of two candy eyes and place on top of the edge of the wings.

Another Seasonal favorite is this delicious pumpkin pie dip: INGREDIENTS

2 c. heavy cream

1 3.4-oz. instant vanilla pudding mix

1/2 c. canned pumpkin

2 tsp. pumpkin pie spice

Ginger snap cookies, for serving

DIRECTIONS: In a stand mixer, beat heavy cream and vanilla pudding mix until stiff peaks form, 1 to 2 minutes.

Add pumpkin and pumpkin pie spice and stir to combine, then chill if desired. Serve with ginger snaps.

HALLOWEEN FUN FACTS Trick-or-treating likely evolved from the

medieval custom of "souling" in England. On All Souls' Day celebrations, poor people would knock on doors asking for food in exchange for saying prayers for the home's dead relatives. Cats have been part of the history of Halloween for centuries. During the ancient Celtic festival of Samhain, priests used cats as part of a ritual to try to predict the future. The "bon" in bonfire is a reference to bones. During Samhain, priests lit large fires to represent the sun returning after the hard winter. They would throw the bones of cattle into the flames, creating a "bone fire."
