Unclear on Current Covid-19 Guidelines? Below is a list of social distancing recommendations that are currently in place.

**Gov. Jay Inslee has issued a Stay at Home, Stay Healthy order. The order requires every Washingtonian to stay at home which will be effective through May 31, except for people:**

- Pursuing an essential activity, like shopping for groceries or going to a medical appointment.
- Getting takeout food. (Food deliveries also are permitted).
- Going to work at an [essential business](#).
- Going outside for walks and exercise, as long as social distancing of six feet is maintained.

#### What's open

All grocery stores, pharmacies, gas stations, food supply chains and other things necessary for continued operations will remain open. In addition, the governor has moved the state into Phase 1 which allows for certain outdoor recreation activities and business activities as long as employers, workers and the public adhere to proper health and safety precautions.

#### Access to state lands

Beginning May 5, the governor has authorized [partial reopening of certain recreational activities](#). Day use will be allowed at state parks and public lands for fishing, hunting and other recreational purposes. Playing golf will also be allowed, following physical distance requirements, and limiting activities to only people within their immediate household.

#### What's prohibited

All gatherings of people for social, spiritual and recreational purposes are prohibited with the exception of [drive-in spiritual services](#). This applies to both private and public gatherings which include everything from sleepovers for children to weddings. All of these types of events must be

postponed for public health and safety.

- Most businesses, except for those deemed essential or authorized under [Phase 1 of the governor's Safe Start reopening plan](#). Businesses that can operate using telework should continue to do so. For businesses where individuals cannot work from home, the Governor's Office has provided [guidance on what businesses are essential](#). Businesses and entities that provide essential services must implement rules that help facilitate social distancing of at least six feet.
